Spending on these services is now £9.6bn. The additional funding described in the document represents a 14% real terms rise over the period. The document also sets out a proposal to make a £508m sustainability and transformation plan (STP) package available to support practices, with additional funding provided by CCGs. A large element of the STP package will be for service redesign, including direct funding for improved access. The document also talks about a new voluntary GP contract supporting integrated primary and community health services. In addition the workforce plan aims to double the growth rate in GPs, adding 5000 GPs in the next five years through new incentives for training, recruitment, retention and return to practice. Upgrades to practice premises are discussed, along with investment in technology to support appointment, consultation and workload management systems. NHS England also mentions of its commitment to reform the Carr-Hill formula, which is used to calculate the global sum paid to each practice.</p>
