Chase Gardiner and his family travelled from Yorkshire to New Cross Hospital's Neonatal Unit to present staff with a donation of £350.

Daniel Gardiner, Chase's father, said: "Chase's mum's water broke at 26 weeks and as there were no specialist care beds available in our home town or neighbouring hospitals, we were rushed to Wolverhampton. Chase was born four days later at 27 weeks weighing just 11b 14oz. He wouldn't be here today



without the amazing skills and knowledge of the NNU staff. They worked their magic."

Chase spent just over two weeks in New Cross Hospital until he was well enough and stable enough to be moved back to Yorkshire and nearer home.

Chase and his family finally went home when he was 10 weeks and five days old - two weeks before what would have been his due date.
