# Walking for Maternity

A former RWT patient has completed a sponsored walk in aid of our maternity department.

Rebecca Higgs, 31, organised the walk following her positive experience from the debrief service at New Cross Hospital.

In August 2018 Rebecca attended the hospital to be induced to give birth to son George, now 14 months. However, shortly after being induced Rebecca had to be rushed for an emergency C-section, meaning that her partner was unable to be present for the birth.

Rebecca said: "I was getting ready to be a mum again, with my partner by my side. He missed the birth of his first son and I wanted to give him that experience this time.

"When I came round from the C-section all I could do was repeatedly say sorry to my partner.

"I carried around a lot of guilt; blaming myself for being induced and I had convinced myself that it was my fault my partner missed out on the birth."

Rebecca found out about the debrief service, and though sceptical, went ahead to book the meeting. The debrief service allows patients to hear why certain steps were taken during their treatment, and ask any questions they have not yet had answered. Rebecca added: "The next morning I almost felt at peace with it all. I knew I had to ring and say thank you and explain I wanted to do my bit and promote the service that I wished I'd have known about sooner.

"I want other mums to know about it so they don't have to go through the year I have just had."

The group started at Walsall Manor Hospital where they then followed a planned route to take them to New Cross Hospital's maternity reception. They raised £400.

Emma McCartney, Professional Midwifery Advocate at New Cross, was ready to meet them at the finish line to thank them and provide refreshments.
